



CHURCH HISTORY OF THE UNION CITY BAPTIST CHURCH

The Baptist Church of Christ constituted itself at the Union Meeting House on April 30, 1812, and affiliated with the Tate's Creek Baptist Association. There were 18 charter members, one of these a Negro woman. Mr. Robert Fried was chosen as paster and served until his death in December of 1819. During his ministry, John Winn in August of 1813 gave the church group the deed for one and one-half acres of land, on which the present church shift meets for worship. David Chenault (1820-1821). Thomas Jarman (1822-1828), James Duvid (1829). Fredrick Shoots (1829-1830) and Thomas Balou (1830-1832) pastored the church during these varly years.


October, 1830, saw a division in the church with a large group going with a sect known as "reformers", followers of the doctiones of Alexander Campbell. The 15 members who held to the original faith saw fruitful results of 16 new members in December of the same year. Some of the pastors serving during the following years were: Peter Tribble (1841-184b), Joseph Arntrose (1846-1852), Smith V. Potts (1855-1859). During the ministry of these men, a brick boilding was erected in 1848, on the grounds occupied by the old log church and boilt groups ("Reformers" and Baptiss) met on alternate Sundays until the Baptiss purchased the Reformers' share for \$200 in 1891. The Church was received into the Boone's Creek Association in 1857, having belonged to both Tate's Creek and South Fork previously, and finally returned to the Tate's Creek Baptist Association in 1861 where it stands bridge.

The Church continued to grow under the ministry of the following pastors: Nathan Edmondson (1859-1960), J.J. Edwards (1863-1869), W.E. Chambliss (1867-72), John C. Ray (1872-78), John G. Pond (1878-86), Juhn J. Willis (1887-96), Richard French (1897), Dr. T.C. Ecton (1898-1902) funder his leadership the church went to preaching twice a monthly, William McMillan (1903), R.L. Brandenburg (1904-06), J.A. Davis (1906-08), David J. Hunt (1906-09), J.N. Vandiver (1909-10), W.S. Taylor (1910-13)-(by this time church membership had reached 194 and held a Hume Coming and Centennial Celebration), E.W. Summers (1913-16), Elmer Lucas (1916-17), Charles Ellis (1917-18), Filmore Bone (1919), A.T. Ross (1920-23), V.E. Filmore (1924-25), WMU WAS ORGANIZED under E.L. Spivey (1925-28), R. Barrack (1929-30), A.B. Oliver (1931-35), and Brigher Overton (1936).

Under the leadership of pastor Joseph Stiles, the church Constructed an educational building in 1939. He served from 1937-41. Marvin Ashlocke (1942-43) and Dr. Wayne Oates (1944) followed Dr. Stiles. A passonage was begun in 1950 under the direction of Pastur Wills Bennett (1945-50) and remodeling and additions of a Bapinstry and basement were completed in 1953 under the leadership of pastor William Stagle (1951-53). In 1954-55 under the leadership of Wilbam B. Craig a stone wall along the road and an outside builletin board were constructed. The highest regular attendance of the church was realized under Pastor William Tucker (1957-58).

During the leadership of Pastor Ronald Kerr, 1959-63, a New Constitution and By-Laws was adopted and the Church celebrated the 150th Anniversary. The Night Circle of the W.M.S. was organized October 11, 1963 under Brother Ted Huckaby who served in 1963-1964. Pastors serving the Church following this period were Brother Michael Watts. 1964-68, Brother Phillip Lee, 1968-69, Brother Ralph Benningfield, 1969-1973; Brother David Johnson, 1973-76, Brother George Fucker, 1977-80; and our present pastor being Brother William R. Smith, April 1981.—Of the Clerks that served the Church, John L. Eades served the longest. 29 years and of the Treasurers who served, Brother Alton Parke served the longest, serving for 37 years 9 months. The oldest living members are Bertha Tribble at the age of 94 and Stella Parke at the age of 92. Walker Covington and Bailay Olds, deacons Ethentus, are the oldest deacons with William Hendricks, Alton Parke, Forniss Park, Florace Parke, Harvey Parke, Creswell Covington, Bill Hendricks, Johnny Covington, Daniel Bowman and David Parke serving as active deacons.

We thank God for this leadership that has brought our church to the celebration of it's 175 years of serving our Union City Community and our Lord, Jesus Christ.

IMPORTANT DATES IN OUR CHURCH HISTORY

1812, April 30th, Church organized with 18 members.

1813, May, Church received from John Winn a deed for one and one half acres of land.

1830, There was a division in the church, a majority of the members joining a new sect known as the reformers. Wonly fifteen members left.

1834, January, The Church agreed to unite with the reformers in building a new house.

1838, A motion was made for the church to decide whether or not she would disband, but in Dec. following they resolved to stand and continue meeting for worship.

1848, Church agreed with the reformed brethern to erect a brick building on the ground accupied by the old log church.

1893, Nov. 3, The Baptist purchased the interst of the reformers in the lot and building.

1887, First organ purchased in the church.

1891, Sunday School organized.

1897, Extensive repairs were made on the building and it was dedicated the fifth Sunday in May.

1897, Nov. Rev. T.C. Ecton accepted pastorate.


1912, April 30, Homecoming and centennial celebration.

1920, November, Rev. A.T. Ross Call.

1939, Sunday School rooms built.
